110 became Secretary to the Operational Officers.

111 In 2000, Chris was elected to the Board of Directors and was the Secretary until the end of 2006.
112 Bob Franz took her under his wing and showed her the ropes. He was her President during those
113 years. Thank you, Bob for all your help and guidance. As Secretary, she took minutes for board
114 meetings every other week as well as taking minutes for all the General Membership meetings.

115 In 2004 Chris was awarded Life Membership – a great honor.

116 When Chris left the Board at the end of 2006 she returned to the job as Secretary for the

First Deputy Chief – Kathryn Donegan – Report Posted

We are officially in the second month of the fourth quarter of the year, and everyone needs 48 hours per quarter. The quarter ends 12/31/22. Please remember to finger in and out on the same shift. If you are going to miss a shift, plan to make up the hours by coming in early and staying late or doing another shift entirely. Please check your hours regularly and submit any necessary adjustments. If you are unsure about hours or about if you need to submit any adjustments, reach out to your day captain or myself. Letters from the third quarter should be out by this time next week.

To qualify for the end of year gift card, you need to have 36 shifts (full 4 or 8 hours) by December 1st. Additionally, you are to have no more than 2 missing review trainings to qualify.

Currently, there is **HIGH NEED** on overnight shifts especially Monday, Tuesday and Friday. The BOD passed a motion to grant gas cards to members who are completing high need shifts IN ADDITION to their regular shift. Look out for further communication regarding this. PLEASE reach out to these captains or me if you can be available for any of these shifts there are now some incentives! Thanks in advance!

If you need **laminated copies of your license or any** certifications, please leave a copy of them in my mailbox with a note and I will get them back to you ASAP. If you are interested in becoming a driver OR a driver trainer, please let me know.

If you have any concerns, please reach out to your captain or appropriate chief so we can assist you in a timely manner. We are always happy to answer questions and address concerns, but we

must be made aware of them first. It's important to follow the communication chain of command so issues get handled accordingly and in a timely manner.

Second Deputy Chief – Dale Bartolomeo – Absent - Report Posted

I am sorry that I cannot be in attendance due to work obligations.

Things that need to be addressed:

ESO/PCR's

Need a tremendous amount of work. PCR's should be completed no later than one day. When PCR's are not completed in a timely fashion, vital information can be left out, forgotten which puts our agency at risk when the State comes to audit us. PCR's should ideally be submitted and completed before leaving the hospital. I understand this is not always possible, however, it is unacceptable that some members do not close their PCR's for days or even weeks.

- o PCR's need to be written professionally and with enough information to allow the hospital to understand what is going on with the patient.

- o The QA/QI committee reviews PCR's and will continue to reach out to those who consistently fail to include pertinent information. I am currently working on an ESO/PCR training to help members understand the expectation of how a PCR narrative should read. Writing only a few sentences is not appropriate. Full sentences are required.

- o Insurance is REQUIRED. DO NOT simply select UTO just because you do not feel like obtaining insurance information. You must try your best to obtain insurance information.

Review Trainings:

- o Please do review trainings every month. You have the entire month to get one review training done. There should be no reason anyone should consistently miss review trainings.

- o If for some reason you fall behind, do NOT do more than one review training in one day.

- o Mandatory review trainings are MANDATORY. This means you must do the training in the allotted time, or you will be suspended until the training is completed.

EMT/CPR Cards:

- o Every active member who Drives, Crew leaders and/or Dispatches must have the minimum valid AHA CPR certification and AHA First Aid certification as per the bylaws. Brian Canty and I have been reaching out to members in regard to this.

- o If you are an EMT, EMT-CC, or a Paramedic, your valid card works fine.

Third Deputy Chief – William Connolly – Report Posted

Dear Members:

With the fall months upon us and pedestrians, cyclists and other vehicles on the roads, it is imperative to increase caution as you drive. Below are some driving methods that can help you drive safely when you are not driving an ambulance and are especially important to help HCFAS Drivers avoid accidents and remain safe:

- Always wear your seatbelt and make sure the crew is safely belted in as well.
- Continually check your mirrors and observe all traffic.
- Be on the **ALERT** for parked cars, pedestrians and cyclists.
- Do not expect you will be given the right of way, even though it ought to be given to you.
- When you drive in rainy weather, reduce your speed and increase your following distance. Make sure there is a safe amount of space on all sides of your vehicle.
- When possible, use a spotter when backing the vehicle, especially at HQ and Huntington Hospital.
- Concentrate on your driving and be prepared for unexpected events.
- Remember to pick up any equipment at the hospital.
- Report any equipment that is damaged or missing,
- **DO NOT DRIVE IF YOU ARE EMOTIONALLY DISTRACTED.**
- **REPORT ALL ACCIDENTS AND INCIDENTS.**

October brought darkness upon us all. Alison Russo was taken from us, killed while on duty.

A couple weeks have passed and it all still feels so surreal. Ali was a wealth of information; her heart was huge and her bite was fierce. She was never afraid to let people know how she felt, but her intentions were always for the best. She did a lot for this agency; she dedicated her life to helping others. She was someone to truly admire and will be forever missed.

I want to stress the importance of bonding with your fellow members, practicing good communication and respect for one another. The more we respect each other and work as a team, the more efficient the care we provide will be. Everyone should know their role upon walking on scene. Just a couple weeks ago we had a cardiac arrest at a local Gym. Bob Biersack and I arrived at the scene with Keith Davis. Seconds after applying the Lucas, Jeff Brenner showed up. Shortly after, our medic Joc McCaffrey came on scene. We all worked as a team under one direction, everything ran so perfectly and we were able to get a pulse back. Unfortunately, the patient died five days later. But the moral of this is that teamwork and communication go a long way. No one knows it all, so take a page from the books of everyone you meet here, reflect on the calls you have been on, ask questions, and work together.

Monday needs two full crews on the 2300 shift ...ALWAYS... 1100 shift could use a Driver if anyone is ever available as well. We have a bunch of radios out there, if anyone is able to at least listen up, it is always appreciated.

It is recommended that each member have more than 50 points at December 31, 2022 so that any subsequent correction of posting errors (such as, activity posted to the wrong member account, duplicate activity posting etc.) will not cause the member to have less than 50 points and therefore not qualify for a year of service credit for 2022.

Fiona Witkowski – Remember, every time the ambulance goes on a call the Crew leader is responsible for making sure there is a PCR. This is true even if the call is cancelled or you transfer the call to another provider.

Also, please do not go directly to the scene of an accident without getting clearance from the Dispatcher.

Gift cards for paid Paramedics:

Richard Stone – Informed the members that a Motion was passed that Paramedic funds were mandated by the town by taking funds out of EMS and being paid out of donations. Discussions were held in open forum.

John Palmieri – Informed the membership that the paid Paramedics receive the same gift cards as the members. The paid Paramedics only need (25) shifts but the members need (45) shifts to be eligible to receive the gift cards. HCFAS funds are for the members and paramedics are not members. These funds should benefit the members and should not be taken out of our funds. John is requesting to rescind the Motion. He inquired about what source the funds should come from. He feels that the money should be taken from District Funds not the HCFAS membership dues funds. Discussions were held in open forum.
