Proposed SOP Change - 04-2023

Proposal:

To change the current holiday budget to account for current inflation rates and rise in membership/crews.

Background/Justification:

The current SOP for Holiday Budget does not reflect the current costs regarding inflation, as well as accumulating up to 3 full crews coming in for a holiday shift.

Change (additions are underlined and deletions are stricken):

Article X, Section 1, Paragraph 12 – Holidays

Being a twenty-four hour a day, seven day a week, three hundred and sixty-five day a year operation, there will be times when crews will be required to be on-duty during holidays. In an effort to make those holidays a little more enjoyable the Squad Chief is authorized to spend an amount not to exceed ~~\$500.00~~ 800.00 for food and refreshments on each pre-approved holiday. The pre-approved holidays to which this authorization applies are:

New Year's Eve Day New Year's Day

Martin Luther King Day Easter Sunday

Memorial Day Labor Day

Independence Day Christmas Eve Day

Thanksgiving Day Christmas Day

Our final total number of calls for 2023 was 6160 with 33 Signal 24's. In 2022, we had 6,205 calls (only 45 more) and 98 Signal 24's. A lot of people stepped up this year and it shows!

Our average "2" time for 2023 was 2:58. You should all be very proud that it was under three minutes – especially because of all of the construction that has been going on!

I am also happy to announce that the most important issues we were experiencing with BRYX, our paging system, have been resolved.

Most of our 24's for 2023 occurred on Friday, during the day. The times we seem to have the most 24's are: 1400-1500 and 1600-1700, with 0100-0200, 1000-1100, and 1300-1400 right behind.

We need people to respond during the day! If you can listen one day – or one hour per week and need a pager, please contact me.

Delegate & Committee Reports:

LOSAP 2023 Points – Bob Franz

The 2023 LOSAP Point listing posted on the bulletin board is being updated periodically. It is requested that each member review their points and report in writing any discrepancies to the LOSAP point committee.

All review trainings had to be completed & submitted by December 31, 2023 to be eligible for LOSAP points for 2023.

The LOSAP point listing is audited by the Town of Huntington's CPA company. If you find any type of errors in your account, please report them to the LOSAP point committee in writing.

It is recommended that each member have more than 50 points at December 31, 2023 so that any subsequent correction of posting errors (such as, activity posted to the wrong member account, duplicate activity posting etc.) will not cause you to have less than 50 points and therefore not qualify for a year of service credit for 2023.

All 2023 LOSAP forms must be completed and submitted to the LOSAP committee by January 16, 2024.

NYS Income Tax Claim for Volunteer Firefighters' & Ambulance Workers' Credit for 2023 – Bob Franz

You can claim the \$200 refundable credit for 2023 on the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance **Form IT-245**. As per the instructions, **you cannot claim the credit if you receive a real property tax exemption that relates to your volunteer service under Real Property Tax Law**. The ambulance workers' credit is available to full-year NYS residents who are active volunteer ambulance workers for the entire tax year for which the credit is claimed. A copy of the Form IT-245 & instructions is posted on the bulletin board. If you have any technical questions, consult your independent tax advisor.

10 % Property Tax Exemption – Bob Franz

The filing deadline with the Town of Huntington (TOH) Assessor is Friday March 1, 2024 for property tax year 12/01/24 to 11/30/25. **The property must be owned by the volunteer or the volunteer and spouse only.** Members who are currently receiving the 5 year or 20 year status tax exemption will have their years status renewed by the Squad by the deadline date.

Current recipients who moved or sold their home prior to March 1, 2024, or had other ownership changes, please drop a note with your detail information in Director Bob Franz's mailbox. If you moved and purchased another home, you must fill out a new application form for your new residence.

Members who will be eligible for the first time (achieved at least 5 years or more of service by 3/1/24 and own a home (title must transfer by 3/1/24), please complete an application form and place it in Director Bob Franz's mailbox before Friday February 2, 2024. Application Forms were distributed to you via email or USPS.

To be eligible, the property must be owned by the volunteer or the volunteer and spouse only, the property must be your prime residence and be in the Town of Huntington and you must have 5- years of active squad service by March 1, 2024.

For members with 20 or more years of service by March 1, 2024, the property can be located anywhere in Suffolk County (Call Bob Franz at 631 421-9121 or email robo4200@hotmail.com for specific details).

Note for members currently receiving the property tax exemption: If you do not want the Squad to renew your property tax exemption on 3/1/24 because you intend to take the \$200 NYS income tax credit for calendar year 2025, please put a note in Bob Franz's mailbox prior to February 2, 2024.

Note: On December 9, 2022 Governor Hochul signed legislation that creates an op-in for all local governments in NYS to provide a 10% property tax exemption for volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers. Prior to this there were a collection of laws that only allowed 30 counties including Suffolk County to have some form of property tax exemption. As a result of this new law, the previous laws were repealed. However, any local government (village, town, school district, fire district, county) that had provided a property tax exemption may continue to do so, but must adopt a new local law or resolution by December 9, 2025 that conforms to the provisions of the new law. Currently the minimum service requirement is five years, Under the new law, each local government must determine a minimum service term requirement for eligibility – two years at minimum, five years at most. As of this writing, the Town of Huntington and the Huntington Fire District have passed resolutions under the new law with a two year service requirement by the local application filing deadline date of March 1st.

Members who meet the eligibility criteria and achieved or will achieve 2 to 4 years of service or 5 years of service by March 1, 2024, please contact Bob Franz.

The Suffolk Educational program for Retention in the Voluntary Emergency Service (SERVES) - Bob Franz

The SERVES Administrative Guide is available on line - Go to www.suffolksbravest.com.

Suffolk County resident student volunteers may attend a college or university in Suffolk or Nassau County or take on line courses from accredited institutions of higher education or attend an authorized workforce vocational training program in Nassau or

Suffolk County. **The applications and supporting documentation for each semester must be submitted no later than the 8th Friday of the academic calendar.**

Go to www.suffolksbravest.com for the guide.

Some highlights of the SERVES program follow.

- The program is a reimbursement program with an award payment made directly to the student-volunteer at the completion of each semester.

- SERVES provides a reimbursement based upon tuition costs at Suffolk County Community College- i.e. as of January 2024, the maximum payment for a 12 plus credit schedule (full-time status) with a GPA of 3.75 to 4.00 or an "A" would be \$2,820. The student-volunteer will receive reimbursement based upon a sliding scale related to their GPA.

- The number of credits supported by the program; **full or part time**; covers a Bachelor's Degree or up to 120 credits (see administrative guide for definition of lifetime credit hours). If you already earned 120 credits of higher education, you are **not** eligible for SERVES.

- The student-volunteer agrees to use SERVES funds only to supplement any tuition not covered by sources of free financial aid (TAP, PELL, APTS and etc.)

- The student-volunteer must maintain acceptable volunteer activity and training during their entire course of study. There is also a volunteer service obligation of one to five years after attendance at a college or university based upon the number of credits taken under the program.

- Applications are date stamped upon receipt and the earliest dated applications shall be reviewed first as SERVES funds shall be disbursed on a first come, first served basis.

Also, the ambulance involved **MUST** be taken off line immediately. If anyone interested in becoming a Driver please contact Jeffrey or Dominic for details.

Carol Nucci for Tom Lemp Class A– stated that the officers were to notify their members that the Class A Uniform Committee was given the opportunity to outfit 10 members for 2023 and 10 members for 2024 with new Class A uniforms. Mary Winter – Expressed her concern regarding the lack of attendance from Board Members and Officers at the General Membership meetings. She feels that their lack of attendance may potentially cause a lack of awareness of the needs and wants of the members.

Jake Levinsky – For ESO there was an update, that was released early by accident. NYS has updated NEMSIS which are datapoints track how well we are doing.

Sharyn Cullen-Kutcher – Sharyn found multiple vials of expired drugs on Unit 20 during A routine ALS Checkout. She also found that some drugs were missing from the drug box.
