Quarter Requirements/Gift Card/LOSAP:

1 48 Quarterly shift-hours per quarter

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The HCFAS calendar year is broken into four quarters. Q1 1/1-3/31, Q2 4/1-6/30, Q3 7/1-9/30 and Q4 10/1-12/31. Each member needs to complete 48 shift-hours during each of these three month blocks. Members that fail to hit 48 hours in any given quarter receive a letter of intent from the 1st Deputy (currently me) and are in bad standing until they catch up on hours. If a member that received a letter is short for another consecutive quarter, they will be suspended for two weeks by the Chief. A third delinquent quarter results in an indefinite suspension pending a hearing. More information can be found in the SOPS Article II, Section 1 (pg 8).

2. 36 shifts completed prior to December 1st

To be eligible to receive a gift card on our Squad Election Day, a member must be in good standing and have completed 36 shifts by December 1st. This is 36 completed shifts. A list of eligible members is provided to the Board of Directors. More information can be found in the SOPS Article X, Section 1, 17G (pg 72).

3. 50 LOSAP Points per calendar year

The Town of Huntington sponsors the Length of Service Awards Program (LOSAP) for HCFAS. Since 2020 our LOSAP program awards \$30 per month for each qualifying year (minimum of 5 years required to be vested) once you reach the age of entitlement of 65. An example would be that you have 10 qualifying years of service and then you will receive \$300.00 a month at the age of 65.

A member can only have a qualifying year towards LOSAP if they hit 50 LOSAP points. It is highly recommended that every member strives to fall safely over 50 points each year in case they are audited and lose points during the audit. Points are awarded for completing duty tours, going on calls, completing your monthly review trainings, attending meetings, etc. Everyone's LOSAP points are posted in the ready room periodically throughout the year.

Monday's had the most 24's with eleven, followed by Friday's with nine and Sunday's with seven. Tuesday and Wednesday both had 4 each, Thursday had 3 and Saturday had 2.

We have only had five 24's since April 1st – This huge decrease in signal 24's are due to Mondays and Fridays placing a 3rd due crew on their schedules throughout the day.

Thank you to our Monday and Friday day captains for thinking of this, and to everyone who has stepped up and helped out on these days! Also, thank you to anyone who has answered pages.

Please note: Only 23% of our 24's occurred on the 2300-0700 shift.

We have acquired many new members in the past few months, and Mike Barker is working diligently at moving existing EMT's through dispatch training. Thank you, Mike, *and* my dispatchers who are training these new members, for all of your hard work!

We do still need more people to listen and answer up. We recently obtained new pagers so that more members can listen up. Delegate & Committee Reports

LOSAP 2023 Points – Bob Franz

The 2023 LOSAP Records List was approved by the Huntington Town Board on April 11, 2024. In compliance with General Municipal Law, the approved list was returned to

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the Squad and posted on the bulletin board for a mandatory 30-day period. It is requested that each member review the information next to their name and report any changes in writing to President Witkowski with a copy to Director Bob Franz. Each reported change must be clearly identified and explained with supporting documentation, if applicable. Please also verify that your legal name is properly indicated. The posted list will be returned to the TOH at the end of the week for further processing. The Town's independent CPA firm is in process of performing an audit of the point list.

2024 HCFAS Scholarship – Deadline July 1st – Bob Franz

The Board of Directors approved the awarding of up to six (6) five hundred-dollar (\$500) Squad scholarships to be given to any non-probationary HCFAS Squad member in good standing or a direct family member (spouse, son, daughter, brother, sister) residing in the same home as the non-probationary HCFAS member in good standing. A drawing will be held at the July 2024 General Membership Meeting to select from those applicants who have applied to Director Bob Franz as of July 1st with the appropriate application form, as supplied by HCFAS, and with the required qualifying evidence. Director Franz will receive from the Chief, a declaration that those applicants are non-probationary Squad members in good standing or family members of non-probationary Squad members in good standing. These scholarships are to be an incentive for the applicants, who must submit documentation (academic transcripts) of at least a 2.0 grade point average for the preceding school year. The applicant must have been enrolled for and completed a minimum of six (6) college credit hours per semester (a minimum of two semesters is required) or the equivalent period at a vocational school. All 2023 scholarship winners are not eligible for the 2024 scholarship drawing. The application form is included in this Pulse and is posted on the bulletin board and website. The form can also be found on the mail folder counter at the Squad.

Incomplete applications submitted to Director Franz will be returned and not processed – all required documentation must be attached. All 2024 winners will be precluded from entering the drawing the following year.

Legislation:

Governor's Budget 24/25 & Legislation: The approved NYS budget was not kind to EMS. Apparently, the legislature would like to see various EMS items become law via the legislative process with stand alone bills. There are several stand alone bills pending in the legislature. Letters or emails should be written and sent to our legislators to support these bills. President Witkowski has sent letters on behalf of the HCFAS. The recent NYSVARA's legislative committee email that was sent to all our members to support various Federal bills via an easy to use on line legislative system via the NAEMT.

EMT-CC Sunset Update: After the discussion and presentation by Chief Mark Brenner at our last GMM, Chief Gregory Miglino of South Country Ambulance and two other members of his squad were in Troy, NY last Tuesday (5/7/24) and Greg spoke against the sunset of EMT-CC at the SEMSCO meeting and answered several related

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questions. Thank you President Witkowski for sending a letter opposing the EMT-CC sunset in July 2027.

OSHA 29 CFR 1910.156 Comment Deadline extended to 6/21/24 – Information obtained from various sources have been distributed to the President and Chief to assist them in their review and comment on this document by the deadline date. There are sections that are related to EMS.

NYS DOH EMS Memorial Dedication – Albany, NY -The date has been changed from May 22, 2024 to a date in September or October 2024. Once a new Flyer is available, it will be Posted.

SEMSCO / REMSCO 2023 State EMS Awards Program – Nomination Deadline has been extended to Friday May 24, 2024 at 5:00 PM – Flyer previously distributed and posted.

Suffolk REMSCO meeting is tomorrow evening at SCEMS and SCACA meeting is on Wednesday evening at Medford VAS.

Suffolk County EMS Week: Chief Greg Miglino, Jr., of South Country Ambulance reported that County Executive Ed Romaine and Legislator Dominick Thorne will be holding a "Bill Signing Ceremony" on Monday, May 20th, at 1100 hours at South Country Ambulance.
