We had our NYSDOH BEMS inspection on September 3, 2024. The DOH inspected our personnel records, certification records, SOPs, By-laws and recent Chief orders. They also inspected 3 ambulances, 1 responder and our ALS supplies. I would like to personally thank First Deputy Chief Mike Como, Second Deputy Chief Keith Rubenstein, Third Deputy Chief John Stevens, Chief Dispatcher Melissa Anastos, Secretary Brian Canty, Treasurer James Mallilo, Captains James Kelly, Matthew Philip, Kenney Cadet, Ex-Chief David Kaufman, Medics Alex Mullin, Mike Moccaldi, Company 6 members Andrew Noueihed, Dan Jian and Christina Denker. Because of our collaborative efforts and many hours of work, of checking and re-checking, the squad met all the criteria of the State to pass inspection.

The Huntington Fall Festival will begin October 11 and end on October 14. We will have crews on for Saturday and Sunday October 12&13. There will be sign-up sheets in the ready room. Please sign up for one of these days.

My recent Pulse article was about the proposed OSHA 1910.156 proposed Emergency Response Rule. It's lengthy but an important document to read. I'm looking forward to your thoughts and comments. My most important take away is that you take note of the 4,500 ambulance crashes that occur each year. **Drivers, slow down and have confidence that you WILL get there on time!**

First Deputy – Michael Como – Report Posted

Thank you everyone for your hard work throughout the year! We are closing out the third quarter at the end of the month.

Qtr Regs/Gift Card/LOSAP

The three sections below can not be repeated often enough:

1) 48 Quarterly shift-hours per quarter

The HCFAS calendar year is broken into four quarters. Q1 1/1-3/31, Q2 4/1-6/30, Q3 7/1-9/30, and Q4 10/1-12/31. Each member needs to complete 48 shift-hours during each of these three month blocks. Members that fail to hit 48 hours in any given quarter receive a letter of intent from the 1st Deputy (currently me) and are in bad standing until they catch up on hours. If a member that received a letter is short for another consecutive quarter, they are suspended for two weeks by the Chief. A third delinquent quarter results in an indefinite suspension pending a hearing.

More information can be found in the SOPS Article II, Section 1 (pg 8).

2) 36 shifts completed prior to December 1st

To be eligible to receive a gift card on our Squad election day, a member must be in good standing and have completed 36 shifts by December 1st. This is 36 complete shifts. A list of eligible members is provided to the Board of Directors.

More information can be found in the SOPS Article X, Section 1, 17G (pg 72).

3) 50 LOSAP points per calendar year

The Town of Huntington sponsors the Length of Service Awards Program (LOSAP) for HCFAS. Since 2020, our LOSAP program awards \$30 per month for each qualifying year (minimum of 5 years required to be vested) once you reach the age of entitlement of 65. An example would be that you have 10 qualifying years of service and then receive \$300/month at the age of 65.

A member can only have a qualifying year towards LOSAP if they hit 50 LOSAP points. It is highly recommended that every member strive to fall safely over 50 points each year in case they are audited and lose points during the audit. Points are awarded for completing duty tours, going on calls, completing your monthly review trainings, attending meetings, etc. Everyone's LOSAP points are posted in the ready room periodically throughout the year.

Drivers

- Reach out to me if you are interested in becoming a driver.

- Current drivers - Consider getting insurance information while on scene. It's in everyone's best interest to collect the information (not just the CL!). The collection of insurance information and the billing money that comes along with it are essential for the continuity of HCFAS operations.

There are many standby opportunities coming up. Keep an eye out for postings from the standby committee. Suzie Phillip is now chair of the committee. Peyton Kalk and Michael Terry are also helping on the committee.

Just a reminder to complete your review trainings on a timely fashion. Each member must have completed at least 10 review trainings by December 1st in order to be a member in good standing.

It is your responsibility to renew your certification. Just remember if you are not an EMT/CC/P and you were accepted prior to Jan 1, 2016 you need to maintain an AHA Heartsaver FA Card and an AHA BLS CPR Card.

A huge Thank you to all who helped make the state inspection go super smooth this past week. It's an unnecessarily stressful process to make everything perfect in an ever changing environment. They did bring up a few issues for us to be mindful of. When testing your portable suction, please take it off the charging mount to test it. Otherwise you will never know if the batteries are usable or not (Or even in there as we found out during an inspection). Secondly, moving forward, we've been fairly laid back with the supply drawers. These can no longer be the dumping grounds or storage bins for ALS supplies. A couple of agencies were fined for this. Thankfully we were not one of them. IV supplies, medications and syringes all must be kept in the coded cabinet. The state has let it be known that they will be stopping ambulances at the hospitals randomly for checks more frequently as they have just onboarded a lot of new inspectors. They are making their presence known.

The rigs will be cycling out this month for some much needed TLC and to install our new safes going on board. Please make sure you are checking the board in dispatch as to what is currently 1st, 2nd, 3rd due etc. and sticking to that order.

Last but certainly not least, as many of you have seen, we made a huge push for closing PCRs recently. There were far too many opened and left open by the same personnel. We have added some new people to the committee and will be reaching out far more frequently if there are issues. REMEMBERING SEPTEMBER 11, 2001

On a clear Tuesday morning, 19 terrorists from the Islamist extremist group al-Qaeda hijacked four commercial airplanes, deliberately crashing two into the Twin Towers in New York City and a third into the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia. After learning about the other attacks, passengers on the fourth plane, Flight 93, launched a counter-offensive, and the plane crashed into an empty field in Western Pennsylvania.

The 9/11 attacks killed 2,977 people from more than 90 Nations.

The oldest victim was 85 years old; the youngest was two. More than 400 were first responders who died performing their sworn duties. My partner Mark Schwartz was one of those that lost his life that morning.

LOSAP 2024 Points

The 2024 LOSAP Point listing posted on the bulletin board is being updated periodically. It is requested that each member review their points and report in writing any discrepancies to the LOSAP point committee. All review trainings must be completed & submitted by December 31, 2024 to be eligible for LOSAP points for 2024. Review Trainings should be completed on a monthly basis, please do not do more than a maximum of two review trainings in a single day.

The LOSAP point committee puts incomplete submitted LOSAP forms for your correction in a basket on the counter on top of the mail folders. Please check this basket and make any required corrections.

The Suffolk Educational program for Retention in the Voluntary Emergency Service (SERVES)

The SERVES Administrative Guide is posted on the bulletin board and is available on line - Go to www.suffolksbravest.com.

Suffolk County resident student volunteers (including probationary members) may attend a college or university in Suffolk or Nassau County or take on line courses from accredited institutions of higher education or attend an authorized workforce vocational training program in Nassau or Suffolk County.

The application and supporting documentation for each semester must be submitted no later than the 8th Friday of the academic calendar.

-The number of credits supported by the program; **full or part time**; covers a Bachelor's Degree or up to 120 credits (see administrative guide for definition of lifetime credit hours). If you already earned 120 credits of higher education, you are **not** eligible for SERVES.

- The program is a reimbursement program with an award payment made directly to the student-volunteer at the completion of each semester.

- SERVES provides a reimbursement based upon tuition costs at Suffolk County Community College

- The student-volunteer agrees to use SERVES funds only to supplement any tuition not covered by sources of free financial aid (TAP, PELL, APTS and etc.)

- The student-volunteer must maintain acceptable volunteer activity and training during their entire course of study. There is also a volunteer service obligation of one to five years after attendance at a college or university based upon the number of credits taken under the program.

- Applications are date stamped upon receipt and the earliest dated applications shall be reviewed first as SERVES funds shall be disbursed on a first come, first served basis.

Members wishing to check their designated beneficiary(s) on their VFIS Group Term Life Insurance or on their VFIS Accident & Sickness Policy please drop a note in Director Bob Franz's mail box or the insurance committee mail box or email Bob Franz

(robo4200@hotmail.com). Eligible members under the squad's group term life insurance program are generally covered for \$50,000 (lower amounts if over 69 years of age). All active members are covered under the VFIS Accident & Sickness policy while on duty; the death benefit is \$250,000. Your beneficiary(s) under the LOSAP program was indicated on your 2023 LOSAP benefit statement which was distributed to you recently.

TOH Amendment to Affordable Housing Code to give Priority to First Responders

Andrea Golinsky was able to attend the August 6th Town Board afternoon meeting and spoke at the hearing in support of an Amendment to the Town's Affordable Housing Code which will give Priority to First Responder Applicants (previous priority applicants will now be secondary) for the purchase of affordable units available anywhere in the Town of Huntington.

Priority will also be given for available affordable rental units.

The Town awards affordable housing based on income, and other eligibility criteria, through a lottery system and lists maintained by the Huntington Community Development Agency.

First Responders are Firefighters and those trained and licensed to provide emergency medical services. Firefighter also attended the hearing and spoke in support of the resolution.
